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Here the king and the pauper are fighting for survival for an hour or a moment and then after they become like worldly humans, but these saints struggle with Maya and the death angle (Kaal) throughout their lives in devotion to the supreme Being (Satswarup) the supreme Lord, but their bravery in devotion never diminishes.

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बामण भाट करे सो तागा ॥ च्यार दिनाँ दुःख होई हो ॥२॥

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When Brahmins and bards faces struggles, but they would feel sad for four days.

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Then the wounds would heal and they would be cured, but the wounds of the saint do not fade away throughout the life and the saint does not become like the worldly people again.

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आठ पोहोर बिन खांडे जूझे ॥ निमकन भूले सोई हो ॥३॥

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These saints keep fighting with Maya and Kaal day and night without a sword, yet they do not forget the worship to the supreme even for a second. In this way saints are brave.

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ओर सूर सब काया मारे ॥ आतम जन छिन खोई हो ॥४॥

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All other warriors kill their bodies but saints lose their soul (Aatma) by weakening them.

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के सुखराम सुरां नर माँही ॥ या सम सूर न होई हो ॥५॥
